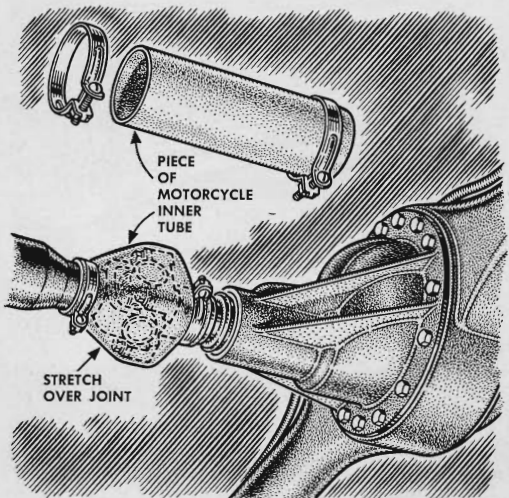




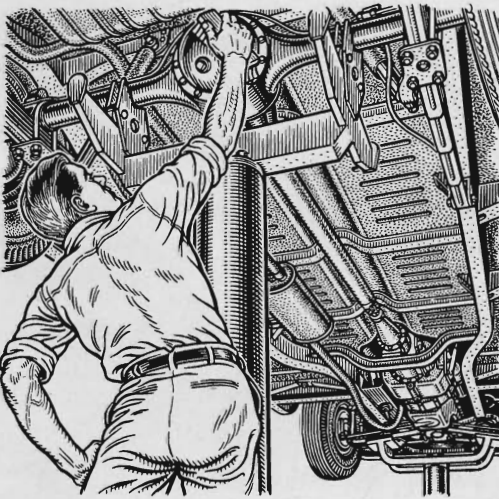
Hints FROM THE MODEL GARAGE



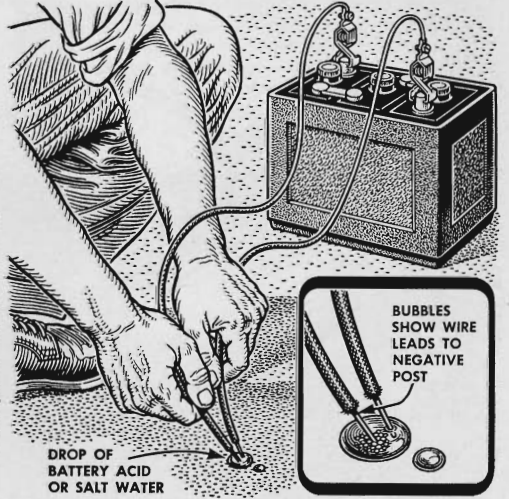
Clean headlights are as important as a clean windshield when driving at night. Even though yours may look clean, tests have proven that a single day's accumulation of dirt on headlight lenses can reduce their effectiveness by as much as half.



Universal joints will stay free of dirt and mud with these protective covers. Cut pieces about 10" long from a small-size inner tube and have your garageman slip them on the next time you have the bearings packed. Close the tube ends with hose clamps.



Running gear will run cooler if steam-cleaned or brushed with solvent once a year. A coating of grease and dirt on the rear axle, transmission and oil pan keeps the heat in, thinning out the lubricants and reducing their efficiency considerably.



If the terminal marks on a battery are worn, attach two wires to it and hold their ends in a drop of battery acid, salt water or saliva. Move the wires close together and bubbles will form around the one that leads to the battery's negative terminal.
