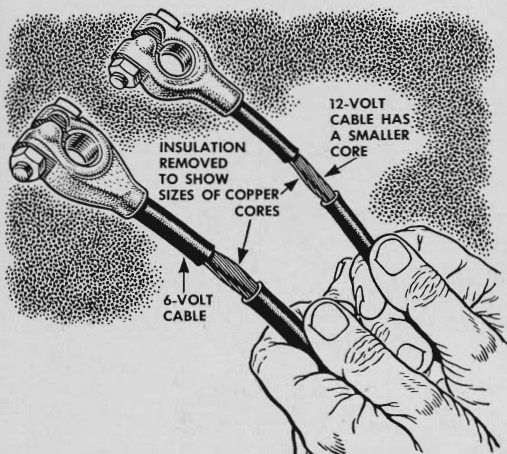
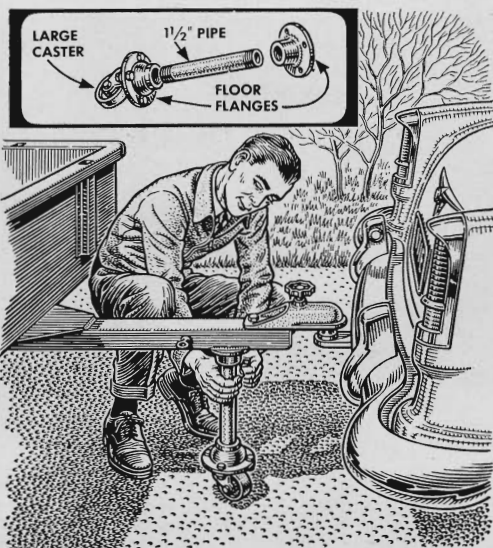


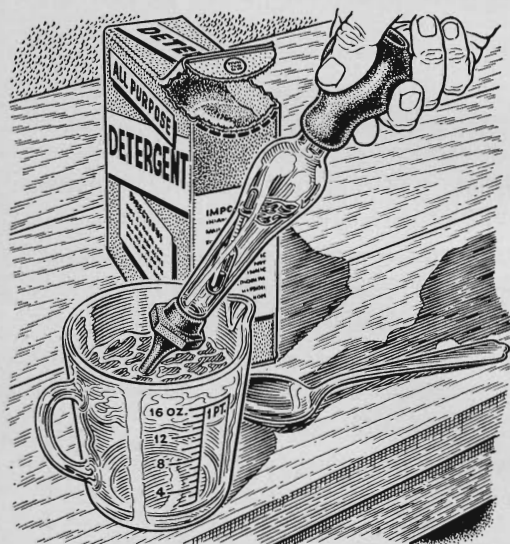
More Hints from the Model Garage



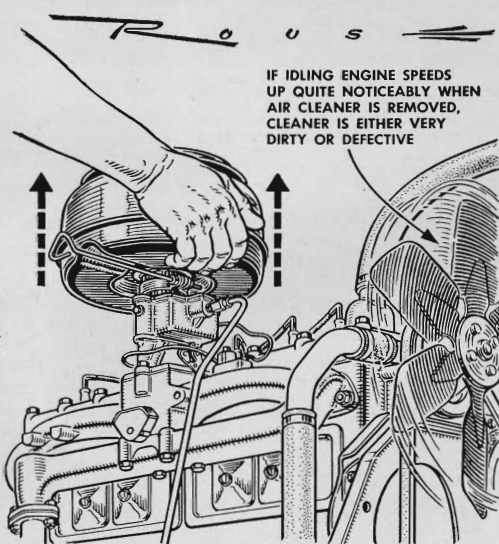
A 6-volt battery cable on a 12-volt car works fine, but don't try it the other way around or you'll get sluggish action. The reason? To save copper, manufacturers make 12-volt cores smaller since they must carry only half the amperage to produce the same wattage (volts \times amps).



A removable caster like this will keep a small trailer level when it's unhitched—and make it easier to shove around. Bolt the flange to the underside of the tongue. Carry the rest of the caster unit in the trailer or tow car. Before unhitching screw the pipe into the flange.



A battery hydrometer may get dirty and milky inside after long use. To clean, dissolve a tablespoon of detergent in a pint of warm water. Suck the solution into the hydrometer and let it stand for a half hour. Then rinse with clean water.



An air cleaner that's dirty outside is undoubtedly dirty inside. So you ought to clean it. Idle the engine as you take it off. If the engine begins to run faster, you can be sure that the cleaner is very dirty—or not functioning properly.
