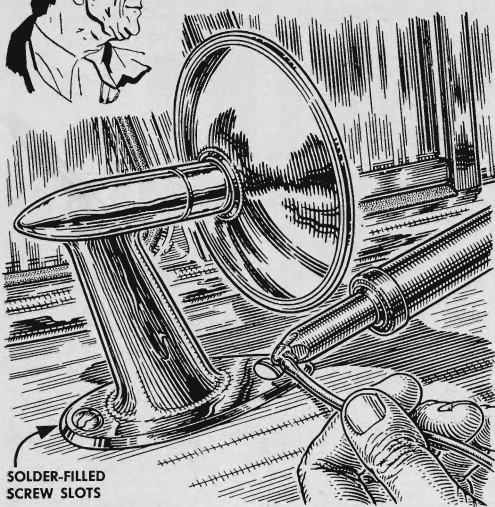
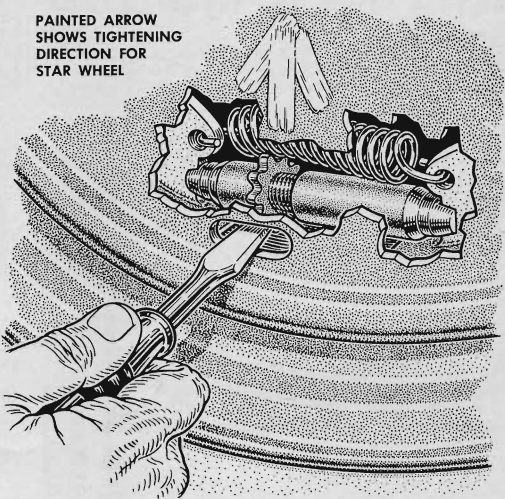


# Hints from the Model Garage



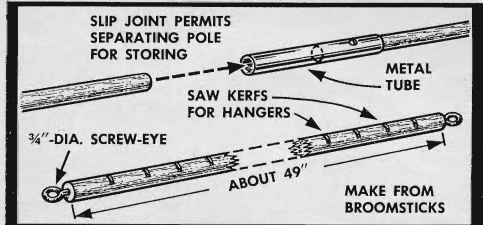
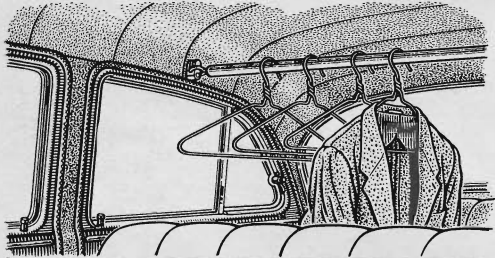
SOLDER-FILLED SCREW SLOTS

**Thieves can't steal** your side-view mirror or other screw-on accessories if you fill the slot in the screwhead with solder. This is better than distorting the slot, since *you* can remove the screw, if necessary, by melting the solder.

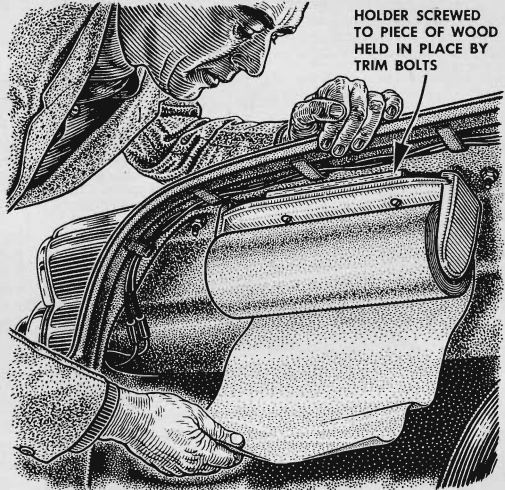


PAINTED ARROW SHOWS TIGHTENING DIRECTION FOR STAR WHEEL

**Adjust your own brakes?** It's difficult to remember from one adjustment to the next which way to rotate the adjustment wheel when you're tightening the brake shoes. An arrow painted over each access slot will eliminate the confusion.



**A sturdy clothes pole** can be made by driving a screw-eye into each end of a broomstick and suspending it from the clothes hooks usually found in a sedan. Lacking hooks, remove two trim screws and insert screw hooks in their holes.

**Paper towels** will stay clean and dry if you keep them on a roller suspended on the inside of the trunk. The handy-to-use holder can be screwed to a block of wood held in place by two of the many exposed trim bolts you'll find in most cars.
