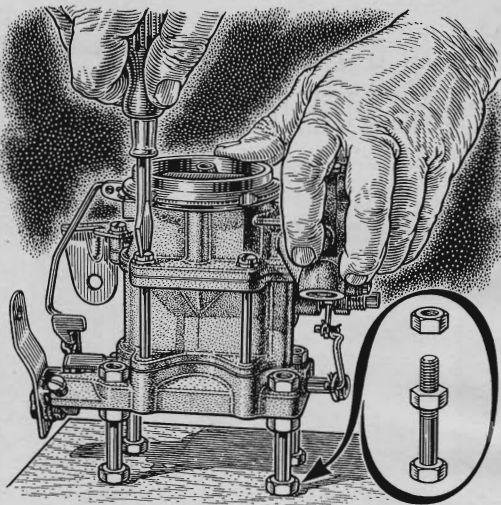


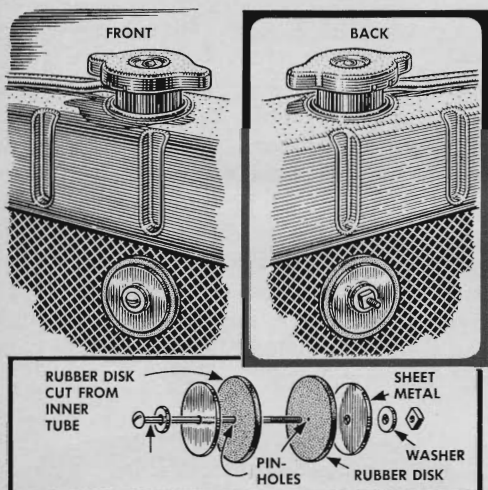
Hints from the Model Garage



An old overshoe makes a handy, rattle-free case for storing a tow chain or other metallic object that clanks and clatters on the floor of the trunk. Quart-size oil cans will also fit in the shoe to keep them from rolling back and forth.



A steady work stand, made by locking four bolts in the holes at the base of a carburetor, will protect the linkage and throttle valves, and permit them to move freely while you're cleaning or overhauling the unit. Use two nuts on each bolt.



Radiator leaking? Expensive repairs can be postponed or avoided by sealing the ends of the core on both sides of the leak with disks cut from inner tube. Clamp the rubber in place with disks of metal, washers, and a long, thin bolt.



A plastic clothes bag—the kind you get free from the cleaner—slipped over the spare tire will keep the usually dirty wheel from soiling things carried in the trunk. Wrap the jack and lug wrench in a bag, too, for the same reason.
