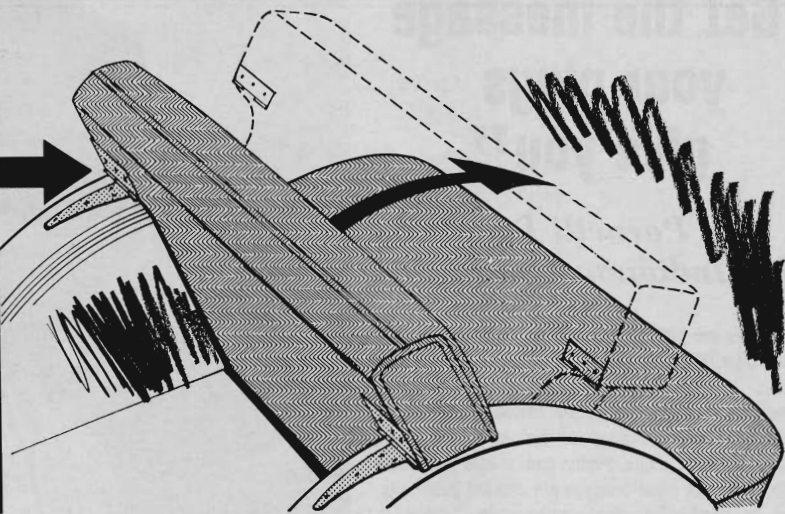
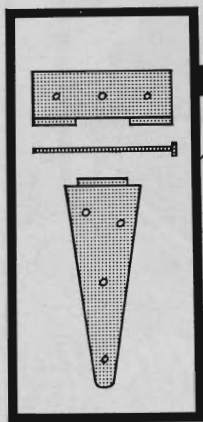


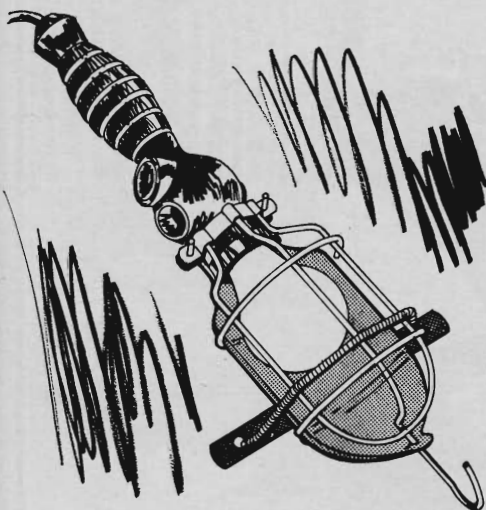


# Hints from the Model Garage

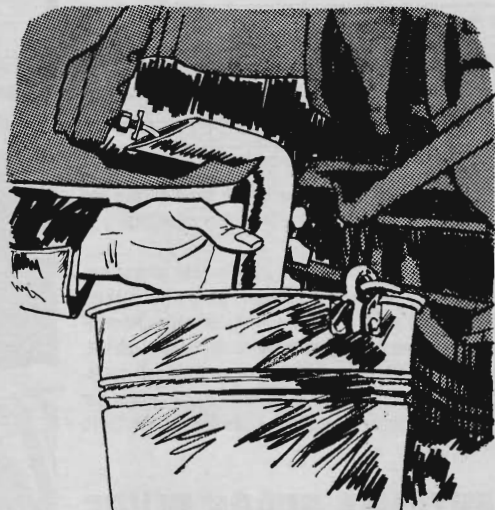


Securing the side latches on the second-seat folding backrest is a matter of concern to many station-wagon owners. During hard braking, heavy loads pushing on the backrest may force the standard latch to give so that the second seat collapses. To

accommodate long objects, it must still be possible to fold the backrest. The solution: barn-door hinges, installed as shown. Pull out the pins, and you can fold the backrest forward; when the pins are in position, the seat is completely secure.



Most trouble lamps will roll if placed where they light up the spot where light is most needed. Stopping the rolling is easy: Just bore two holes in a metal strip 6" long and secure it to the lamp with a thin spring around the light guard.



When you drain your radiator, you may lose precious antifreeze because of the drain-cock position, which causes dripping and splattering. Save the fluid by making a diagonal cut in an old elbow water hose and draining through it into a bucket.
